Description of your role

The Hall Monitors assists the Religious Education staff in creating and maintaining an efficient and effective learning environment.

1. The Hall Monitor is faithful in their attendance at scheduled sessions.
2. The Hall Monitor helps maintain an adult presence in the school hallways during Religious Education classes.
3. The Hall Monitor helps insure that school facilities are kept secure and orderly during Religious Education activities.
4. The Hall Monitor helps insure that students walking in the hallways are directed to their approved destination. The Hall Monitor will promote safe passage rules.
5. The Hall Monitor can assist in moving equipment, books and classroom materials as needed.

What qualifications are required to become a hall monitor?

1. The Hall Monitor is a responsible adult with a willingness and ability to help maintain an orderly and safe environment in the school.
2. The Hall Monitor will work patiently with children and other Religious Education team members.
3. The Hall Monitor will complete a background check and Virtus Training, as needed.

What can I expect in my role as a hall monitor?

1. Most Hall Monitors find satisfaction in working with the students and Religious Education team.
2. Most Hall Monitors enjoy working on the Religious Education team as they provide a service to the religious education effort and the students.
3. Hall Monitors find that working as part of the Religious Education team is fun.

What kind of support can I expect?

1. The parish provides a dedicated staff member to assist the Hall Monitor in his/her role.
2. The parish provides an environment conducive to teaching and learning.
