1. This Award is intended to support Faith Formation Leaders (FFLs)* and Catholic School Administrators (CSAs). Annually each FFL and CSA is awarded a voucher to participate in one (1) VLCFF Course/Seminar. Vouchers are a gift through the Archbishop Kucera Educational Grants.
 2. The desired outcome is:
 - a. To have “well formed” faith formation leaders serving the parishes and schools in the Archdiocese.
 - b. To encourage parish commissions and school boards to invest in faith formation efforts for catechists and Catholic schoolteachers.

4. The voucher is transferable to a catechist, teacher, or commission/board member of the parish/cluster/system/school where the FFL and/or CSA are employed.
5. The 2018-2019 Voucher is good for any VLCFF course/seminar in which the course registration period is open prior to June 30, 2019. Vouchers cannot be accumulated from year to year.
6. To register for a Dayton VLCFF Course:
 - a. At least a week before the registration closes for a given cycle, send Ann Knier an email with your name, position/job, the name and location of the parish/cluster/system/school where you work, phone number, email address, and the course (and cycle) you will be taking. You will then receive a payment code to utilize in the registration process.
 - b. Go to <http://www.dbqarch.org> and click on “Dayton Online Program” at the bottom of the webpage to register for the course you wish to take. Early registration is encouraged since courses fill up quickly.
7. Participants assume the cost of any resources required to take a course as well as any cost associated with taking a course for college credit.
8. Participants are expected to successfully complete the course/seminar.
